Content Note //

This play contains the presence of theatrical firearms and a gunshot. There is strong language that is demeaning towards women and gay men. There are strong themes and mention of sexual assault, torture, and physical abuse.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Just over 50 years ago last September, the democratically-elected government of Chile led by leftist President Salvador Allende was overthrown by a military coup led by General Augusto Pinochet, who maintained control for 17 years. In 1990, General Pinochet allowed a presidential election that he expected to win. He didn't. After negotiations and arm-twisting, a power-sharing agreement was reached. The election winner Patricio Alwyn was named president while Pinochet retained control of the army.

A truth and reconciliation committee, the Rettig Commission, was established to investigate the people killed, or "disappeared" and presumed dead, during the military dictatorship. While the commission couldn't name or punish perpetrators, the recognition of the 2,095 dead and 1,102 missing was an important turning point for Chilean justice. In 2004, the Valech Report confirmed over 28,000 arrests that led to incarcerations and, often, torture. In 2011, the Chilean government officially recognized 36,948 survivors of torture and political imprisonment.

Those statistics can be both horrifying and mind-numbing. The playwright, Ariel Dorfman, who served President Allende as a cultural advisor, seeks to put a face and story to those numbers. He sets his play "in any country that has given itself a democratic government just after a long period of dictatorship." *Death and the Maiden* has been translated into Hindi, Persian, Polish, Spanish, Korean, Lithuanian, and German, among others, and was staged in 57 countries by 1995, five years after it was published.

The story of these three people and their fateful meeting one weekend in 1990 is not easy to experience as truths are painfully revealed and frustratingly obscured. The course of justice is tangled but we are challenged to recognize our own responsibility to see, hear, and bear witness to the victims.
