DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Some of my favorite moments in theatre are watching performers attempt nearly impossible tasks. Can you catch three tennis balls all coming from different directions at once? No? What if your life depends on it? Watching an invested performer TRY to catch everything flying at them as if it were vitally important is so entertaining and ENDEARING to me. It's not about whether or not you achieve your goal, it's seeing the honest effort towards that goal. And the more difficult the task, the more engaging the story.

With *The 39 Steps*, we have several endearing and nearly impossible tasks to observe: within the story, we have a man accused of a crime he didn't commit, being hunted by both the police AND the real bad guys! This story was first a novel, then Alfred Hitchcock put it on the map by making it into an EPIC film with a cast of at least 60. Which brings me to the next nearly impossible task for you to observe: how WE are telling this story!

We have a cast of FOUR, telling the same epic story. We don't have a movie set, we have "found objects" in a theatre (along with an amazing backstage crew who will make some cameos!). We have one woman playing three roles, we have two men playing over 30 roles, and one man who has to catch all the metaphorical tennis balls being thrown at him by the other actors.

We are charged with creating speeding trains, moving cars, airplane chases, tall bridges, scenes with ten people told by three people, and countless other NEARLY impossible tasks. Oh, and while we are hopefully entertaining you with this ridiculousness, we must keep you caring about the characters hopes and dreams.

EVERYONE involved with this show is charged with catching multiple balls at once, including the audience! So lean forward and cheer us on!! Thank you for being with us!!!!

CAST AND CREW

Logan Weilbaker (Richard Hannay) is a freshman at Wabash College. Logan is passionate about pursuing theatre while at Wabash, and he intends to get his MFA after graduation then become a famous actor.
