A NOTE ABOUT MUSIC

To compose the music for this production I relied heavily on medieval instruments sampled by musicologist Eduardo Tarilonte. These instruments use extensive multisampling, dynamic layering, and diverse articulations. Among the medieval instruments you will hear are Organetto, Frame Drums, Nyckelharpa, Viola de Roda, Hurdy Gurdy, Viola da Gamba, Baroque Guitar, Gittern, Medieval Lute, Psaltery, Gemshorn, Alto Recorder and Crumhorn.

All instruments were recorded using a Neumann U87 microphone and captured with close mic techniques, avoiding unwanted room reflections. Player sounds like fret noises and finger releases were also captured to enhance the natural sound of the instruments as played live.

I also used the 40-male, 25-female Insolidus choir conducted by Petr Polonanik. Insolidus contains 8 microphone positions and revolves around a deep set of meticulously sampled articulations including an assortment of multi-vowels that were sampled dynamically.

To reflect *The Amateurs* blend of Medieval and modern performance styles, I sometimes used these instruments as recorded with minimal processing; other times I applied sound design (typically delay, EQ, and reverb) to significantly alter the sounds produced.

All music is original except for a melodic variation of the traditional *King of Denmark's Galliard*, which I used for one cue and remixed for another.
