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#### **Director's note**

Thank you for being here for this performance of *Where is Our Beloved Community?*, an original production highlighting stories of Wabash students, faculty, staff, and alumni of color. I invite you to join us in respectfully hearing the deeply personal and vulnerable experiences of our storytellers, all who are part of this college community.

Dr. Martin Luther King challenged us to create a beloved community built on love and peace in 1966 in his speech "Nonviolence: The Only Road to Freedom":

"I must continue by faith or it is too great a burden to bear and violence, even in self-defense, creates more problems than it solves. Only a refusal to hate or kill can put an end to the chain of violence in the world and lead us toward a community where men [people] can live together without fear. Our goal is to create a beloved community and this will require a qualitative change in our souls as well as a quantitative change in our lives."

This is a space to listen deeply with love and care and an open heart. This is not a space to argue, deny, or discard the lived experiences of our brothers and sisters. Our hope is that you leave the theater, following the show, with deep emotions. Our hope is that those emotions fuel questions and conversations that can lead to healing and growth on campus and in our community.

Most of all, we hope for a campus that fully lives into our mission by celebrating brave inquiry and pursues justice without fear or indifference. We can build a Beloved Community, together!
