Our Little Giants are 8-1 and tied for first place in the NCAC with DePauw, which is 9-0 and comes into the game ranked ninth in the latest NCAA Division III football poll. As some of our fellow alumni who have tickets can tell you, the game will take place at Blackstock Stadium in Greendingle. Festivities begin at 1:07 p.m. EST on Saturday. Winner "takes all" in that, if Wabash wins, it gets back possession of the Bell and also earns an automatic bid to the NCAA Div. III football playoffs. Go Wabash!

If you can't get to a watch party but have Facebook or YouTube, you can still see the game. Yes, DePauw is a heavy favorite. We've seen that before.

The game will be streamed live on the ISC Network (https://www.iscsportsnetwork.com/) and through the ISC Facebook Live and YouTube channels. Comcast Xfinity Channel 81 will also carry the game in the Indianapolis, Fort Wayne, and Lafayette areas.

SPEAKING OF FAVORITES – Sports Gambling is the next topic for "After the Bell," Sports betting seems to be inseparable from sports these days, with revenues growing from approximately \$1 billion in 2019 to \$11 billion in 2023. By contrast, the NFL's total revenue in 2023 was \$13 billion. Interestingly, sports betting looks quite a bit different than it did before 2013. 
